Summary of the event:	The seminar on GATE 2026 was organized to help students understand the exam pattern, syllabus, and effective preparation strategies. It provided a detailed overview of the exam structure, which consists of a single paper with multiple sections including General Aptitude and the candidate's chosen engineering discipline. The exam is computer-based and lasts for 3 hours, with a total of 65 questions carrying 100 marks. The questions are a mix or multiple-choice questions (MCQs), multiple select questions (MSQs), and numerical answer type (NAT) questions.
	Key highlights of the exam pattern discussed included:
	 Sections: General Aptitude (15 marks) and Engineering Mathematics & Subject-specific questions (85 marks). Types of questions: MCQs, MSQs, and NATs. Marking scheme: Negative marking for wrong MCQ answers, no negative marking for MSQs and NATs. Syllabus: Emphasis on core engineering subjects relevant to each branch, along with aptitude and reasoning skills. Difficulty level: Ranges from moderate to challenging, requiring conceptual clarity and problem-solving skills. The seminar also provided insights on time management during the example question selection strategies, and the importance of practicing previous years
	question papers to familiarize with the exam style. Overall, the seminar aimed to equip students with the knowledge an confidence to approach GATE 2026 effectively.
Outcome(s):	The GATE 2026 seminar successfully enhanced students' understanding of the exam pattern, syllabus, and preparation techniques. Participants gaine clarity on the structure and types of questions, enabling them to strategize the study plans effectively. The session boosted their confidence and motivation equipping them with practical tips for time management and question selection. Overall, the seminar empowered students to approach the GAT exam with a focused mindset and better preparedness, increasing their chance of success
