Summary of the event:	<p>CSMSS Chhatrapati Shahu College of Engineering (CSCOE), Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar, successfully organized an Eight-Day Faculty Development Program (FDP) on Universal Human Values Level-II (UHV-II) from 07th to 14th August 2025, in association with the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE). The program was designed to facilitate deeper understanding, self-reflection, and practical implementation of Universal Human Values among faculty across various disciplines. The sessions were conducted by experienced facilitators and observer appointed by AICTE. The FDP brought together educators from Engineering, Polytechnic, Pharmacy, Agriculture, and Ayurvedic colleges from the Marathwada region, enabling a collaborative and value-driven academic experience.</p> <p>The Faculty Development Program on Universal Human Values – Level II (UHV-II) aimed to provide deeper insights into the foundations of human values, enable self-exploration, and empower faculty members to integrate value-based education into their teaching-learning practices. The program was organized under the framework of AICTE to enhance the overall well-being of individuals, institutions, and society.</p> <p>Dr. Ganesh Dongre, Principal CSMSS CSCOE addressed the participants, highlighting the importance of integrating values in technical education. Participants from various institutions shared their reflections, learnings, and personal experiences during the FDP. Many appreciated the immersive format, content relevance, and warm facilitation.</p> <p>Dr. Datta Pawase Bhaiya, AICTE Observer, addressed the gathering and acknowledged the sincere efforts of the organizers and facilitators. He encouraged participants to practice and promote Universal Human Values in their personal and professional lives. Participants reported enhanced clarity and sensitivity toward human relationships, ethical responsibilities, and holistic development. Institutions pledged to conduct regular UHV sessions, reflective activities, and follow-ups</p>



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with FDP alumni. Local coordinators and Co-facilitators will continue to mentor peers and organize future UHV-I and UHV-II programs in the region. Continued collaboration with AICTE and UHV resource persons for scaling value-based education across institutions.
